



## **REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL**

### **Health insurance coverage for staff in Sierra Leone**

#### **The Request:**

Clinton Health Access Initiative (CHAI) is pleased to invite interested health insurance providers in Sierra Leone to submit proposals for the provision of health insurance coverage for its staff in Sierra Leone. The interested provider will propose a health benefits package for consideration by CHAI for at least 50 national staff and dependents to be covered under the health benefits scheme beginning February 2022.

The submitted proposal should include the following information:

#### **A. Provider's experience and client base in Sierra Leone:**

1. Expertise in providing health insurance packages for national and or international organizations.
2. References of the provider, number and scale of similar services provided to national and or international organizations in the past.

#### **B. Nature of proposed services**

1. Coverage limits
2. Waiting periods and exclusions
  - a. Period of enrolment
  - b. Period for types of care
  - c. Exclusions
2. Services covered
3. Minimum out-of-pocket costs
4. Provider network for services covered in Sierra Leone
5. Geographic scope of coverage
